AN ACT

To incorporate the Ashwood Cemetery Association,
in the Town of Weymouth.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. E. Atherton Hunt, Charles P.
2 Hunt, Nathaniel F. T. Hunt, Richard A. Hunt,
3 Granville E. Field, Edmund S. Hunt, Elias Rich-
4 ards, and William H. Chipman, their associates and
5 successors, are made a corporation by the name
6 of the Ashwood Cemetery Association, for the
7 purpose of managing, improving, and controlling
8 the grounds situated in one enclosure on Broad
9 and Front streets, in the town of Weymouth, set

10 apart by the Union Religious Society, in the towns
11 of Weymouth and Braintree, for the burial of the
12 dead.

1 SECT. 2. The said corporation may acquire
2 and hold real and personal estate to an amount
3 not exceeding ten thousand dollars, and shall have
4 all the rights and privileges, and be subject to all
5 the duties, restrictions and liabilities contained in
6 general laws which now are or hereafter may be
7 in force relating to similar corporations, except as
8 herein otherwise provided.

1 SECT. 3. The said Union Religious Society is
2 authorized to transfer and convey said grounds
3 on Broad and Front streets to the said Ashwood
4 Cemetery Corporation when organized: *provided*,
5 that a majority of the members of said society
6 shall vote so to do, after being duly notified of
7 the time and place of the meeting called for such
8 intended action.

1 SECT. 4. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
