AN ACT

Granting Land for a School to the Town of Florida.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The town of Florida is hereby
2 granted the perpetual right to hold, occupy and
3 control, free of rent or charge by the Common-
4 wealth, for the purpose of erecting a schoolhouse
5 and maintaining a school thereon, a parcel of land
6 now owned by the Commonwealth, and situate in
7 said town of Florida, being a part of the Trues-
8 del Farm, so called, containing five hundred and
9 thirteen one-thousandths of an acre, and bounded
10 as follows: Northwesterly by the centre line of a
11 discontinued town road, northeasterly by the
12 highway leading from the Hoosac Tunnel Post
13 Office to Readsboro, and southerly by land of the
14 heirs of Dennis Buckley.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
