**DECISION**

**S & P RESTAURANT INC. DBA PARKER HOUSE GRILLE**

S & P Restaurant Inc. dba Parker House Grille (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, September 4, 2012, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05(2), to wit: c.138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Bailey's Compliance Check Field Report.

1. Investigator Bailey's Compliance Check Field Report dated May 4, 2012; and
  2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

FACTS

1. On Friday, May 4, 2012, at approximately 8:28 p.m., Investigators Doyle and Bailey conducted an investigation of the business operation of S & P Restaurant Inc. dba Parker House Grille.
2. An underage operative working with investigators was in possession of an alcoholic beverage, a bottle of Bud Light beer. The underage operative was not asked for identification.


CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2), to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34. Therefore the Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**
