

For the salary of the messenger in the treasurer's department, eight hundred and twenty-five dollars. Messenger.

For such additional clerical assistance in the treasurer's department as may be necessary for the despatch of public business, a sum not exceeding thirty-two hundred eight dollars and thirty-three cents. Clerical assistance.

For incidental and contingent expenses in the treasurer's department, a sum not exceeding thirty-six hundred sixty-six dollars and sixty-six cents. Expenses.

For such expenses as the treasurer and receiver general may find necessary in carrying out the provisions of the act imposing a tax on collateral legacies and successions, a sum not exceeding nine hundred sixteen dollars and sixty-six cents. Tax on collateral legacies, etc.

For the salary of the deputy sealer of weights, measures and balances, thirteen hundred and seventy-five dollars. Deputy sealer of weights, etc.

For travelling and other expenses of the deputy sealer of weights, measures and balances, a sum not exceeding seven hundred dollars; and for furnishing sets of standard weights, measures and balances to towns not heretofore provided therewith, and to each newly incorporated town; also to provide cities and towns with such parts of said sets as may be necessary to make their sets complete, a sum not exceeding four hundred dollars. Expenses.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE SALARIES AND EXPENSES OF THE GAS AND ELECTRIC LIGHT COMMISSIONERS. Chap. 13

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth from the ordinary revenue, for the gas and electric light commissioners, for the eleven months ending on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and six, to wit: — Appropriations.

For the salaries of the commissioners, ten thousand eighty-three dollars and thirty-three cents. Gas and electric light commissioners.

For clerical assistance to the commissioners, a sum not exceeding thirty-seven hundred fifty-eight dollars and thirty-three cents. Clerical assistance.

For statistics, books, stationery, and for the necessary Expenses.

- expenses of the commissioners, a sum not exceeding twenty-two hundred ninety-one dollars and sixty-six cents.
- Inspection of electric meters. For the inspection of electric meters, a sum not exceeding eight hundred dollars.
- Gas inspector. For the salary of the gas inspector, twenty-two hundred ninety-one dollars and sixty-six cents.
- First assistant. For the salary of the first assistant inspector, thirteen hundred and seventy-five dollars.
- Second assistant. For the salary of the second assistant inspector, eleven hundred dollars.
- Deputies, etc. For the compensation of deputies, travelling expenses, apparatus, office rent and other incidental expenses, a sum not exceeding six thousand dollars.
- Annual report. For the printing and binding of the annual report of the commissioners, a sum not exceeding sixteen hundred dollars.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

*Chap. 14* AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE SALARIES AND EXPENSES OF THE HARBOR AND LAND COMMISSIONERS.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

- Appropriations. SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth from the ordinary revenue, for the purposes specified, for the eleven months ending on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and six, to wit:—
- Harbor and land commissioners. For the salaries of the harbor and land commissioners, seventy-nine hundred and seventy-five dollars.
- Engineers, clerical assistance, etc. For the compensation and expenses of engineers, and for clerical and other assistance to the commissioners, a sum not exceeding twenty-seven thousand dollars.
- Travelling expenses. For travelling and other necessary expenses of the commissioners, a sum not exceeding six hundred and eighty-seven dollars.
- Office expenses, etc. For incidental and contingent office expenses of the commissioners, to include the printing and binding of their annual report, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.
- Town boundary atlases. For printing town boundary atlases, a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars.
- Preservation of harbors, etc. For surveys of harbors and for improving and preserving the same, and for repairing damages occasioned by
