

fees, travel, contingent and incidental expenses, a sum not exceeding thirteen hundred and seventy-five dollars.

INSPECTION DEPARTMENT.

Deputy chief of inspection department. For the salary of the deputy chief of the inspection department of the district police, twenty-two hundred dollars.

Clerk. For the salary of the clerk in the inspection department of the district police, five hundred and fifty dollars.

Members, compensation. For the compensation of the members of the inspection department of the district police, a sum not exceeding fifty thousand four hundred sixteen dollars and sixty-six cents.

Travelling expenses. For travelling expenses of the members of the inspection department of the district police, a sum not exceeding thirteen thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars.

Operating the steamer Lexington. For the expenses of operating the steamer Lexington which is in charge of the chief of the district police and used in the enforcement of the fishery laws of the Commonwealth, a sum not exceeding nine thousand dollars.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 36 AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE SALARIES AND EXPENSES OF THE MASSACHUSETTS HIGHWAY COMMISSION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Appropriations. SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth from the ordinary revenue, for the purposes specified, for the eleven months ending on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and six, to wit: —

Massachusetts highway commission. For the salaries of the Massachusetts highway commission, the sum of seventy-seven hundred ninety-one dollars and sixty-six cents.

Engineers, clerks, etc. For the salaries of the engineers, clerks and assistants in the office of the commission, a sum not exceeding thirteen thousand one hundred twenty-six dollars and sixty-six cents.

Expenses. For travelling and other expenses of the commission, printing, postage and necessary office expenses, a sum not exceeding fifty-nine hundred fifty-eight dollars and thirty-three cents.

For rent of offices for the use of the commission, a sum not exceeding four thousand three hundred fifty-four dollars and sixteen cents. Rent of offices.

For the printing and binding of the annual report of the commission, a sum not exceeding twelve hundred dollars. Annual report.

For care and repair of road-building machinery, a sum not exceeding thirty-five hundred dollars. Road-building machinery.

For expenses in connection with the registration of motor vehicles and the licensing of operators thereof, a sum not exceeding ten thousand eighty-three dollars and thirty-three cents. Registration of motor vehicles.

For the maintenance of state highways, a sum not exceeding sixty-four thousand one hundred sixty-six dollars and sixty-six cents. State highways.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT IN ADDITION TO AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE DECENNIAL CENSUS. Chap. 37

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The sum of fifty thousand dollars is hereby appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth from the ordinary revenue, to meet additional expenses in completing the census field work, and for salaries of the clerical force required for tabulations, and for such other expenses as may be necessary, the same to be in addition to any amount heretofore appropriated for this purpose. Expenses of taking the decennial census.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE SALARIES AND EXPENSES OF THE RAILROAD COMMISSIONERS. Chap. 38

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are appropriated, to be paid out of the Railroad Commissioners' Fund, to provide for the expenses of the railroad commissioners, for the eleven months ending on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and six, to wit: — Appropriations.

For the salaries of the railroad commissioners, eleven thousand nine hundred sixteen dollars and sixty-six cents. Railroad commissioners.
