For the salary of the commissioner of state aid and pensions, twenty-two hundred ninety-one dollars and sixty-six cents. Commissioner of state aid and pensions.

For the salary of the deputy commissioner of state aid and pensions, eighteen hundred thirty-three dollars and thirty-three cents. Deputy.

For the salary of the chief clerk of the commissioner of state aid and pensions, thirteen hundred and seventy-five dollars. Chief clerk.

For the salaries of the agents of the commissioner of state aid and pensions, thirty-eight hundred fifty dollars and ninety-eight cents. Agents.

For the salary of the bookkeeper of the commissioner of state aid and pensions, eleven hundred ninety-one dollars and sixty-six cents. Bookkeeper.

For the salaries of additional clerks of the commissioner of state aid and pensions, a sum not exceeding thirty-five hundred fifty-six dollars and sixty-six cents. Additional clerks.

For incidental and contingent expenses of the commissioner of state aid and pensions, including necessary travel, a sum not exceeding twenty-seven hundred sixty-eight dollars and thirty-four cents. Expenses.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR SALARIES AND EXPENSES Chap. 40  
AT THE STATE PRISON.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth from the ordinary revenue, for the state prison, for the eleven months ending on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and six, to wit: — Appropriations.

For salaries, a sum not exceeding seventy-four thousand two hundred and fifty dollars. State prison, salaries.

For other current expenses, a sum not exceeding seventy-four thousand one hundred and thirty-seven dollars. Expenses.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
