AN ACT

To incorporate the Kenoza Riding Park Association in Haverhill.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. John Gardner, Alvah S. Shedd and Albert
2 L. Kimball, their associates and successors, are hereby
3 made a corporation by the name of the Kenoza
4 Riding Park Association, for the purpose of establish-
5 ing and maintaining in the town of Haverhill in the
6 county of Essex, a riding park ; with all the powers
7 and privileges, and subject to all the duties, liabilities
8 and restrictions set forth in all general laws which
9 now are, or hereafter may be in force relative to such
10 corporations.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold such real and
2 personal estate as may be necessary and convenient

3 for the purpose aforesaid, not exceeding in value ten
4 thousand dollars.

1 SECT. 3. The capital stock of said corporation
2 shall not exceed ten thousand dollars, divided into
3 shares of fifty dollars each.

1 SECT. 4. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
