## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-Six.

### AN ACT

Concerning the Fitchburg Railroad Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—*

1    SECT. 1. The Fitchburg Railroad Company is  
2 hereby authorized to locate, construct and maintain a  
3 railroad track or tracks, which shall commence at a  
4 point on the Watertown Branch Railroad near the  
5 arsenal station (so called) and extend to the United  
6 States arsenal in Watertown.

1    SECT. 2. Whenever said tracks shall cease to be  
2 of use and remunerative to said company, they shall  
3 have the right to remove the same.

1    SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
