AN ACT

To incorporate the Boston Ice Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. Samuel E. Sewell, Joseph H. Chadwick,
2 Norman C. Munson, their successors and assigns, are
3 hereby made a corporation under the name of the
4 Boston Ice Company, with a capital stock of not more
5 than two hundred thousand dollars, to be divided into
6 shares of one hundred dollars each, for the purpose of
7 supplying the city of Boston and vicinity with ice,
8 with all the personal privileges, and subject to all the
9 liabilities set forth in the sixtieth chapter of the Gen-
10 eral Statutes; and said corporation may hold real and
11 personal estate necessary for the above purpose.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation at the first meeting,
2 shall fix the amount of its capital stock; and at any

3 subsequent meeting of the stockholders called for the
4 purpose, may increase the same, not exceeding the
5 limit fixed by this act.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.

3 subsequent meeting of the stockholders called for the
4 purpose may increase the same not exceeding the
5 limit fixed by this act.

4 Sec. 8. This act shall take effect upon its
5 passage.
