## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy.

### AN ACT

Making additional Appropriations for certain Expenses authorized in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, and previous years, and for other purposes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—*

1    SECT. 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned [are ap-  
2    propriated to be paid out of the treasury of the  
3    Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue, except in  
4    cases otherwise ordered, for the purposes specified  
5    herein, to wit :—

#### LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT.

6    For printing and binding ordered by the senate or  
7    house of representatives or by the concurrent order  
8    of the two branches, a sum not exceeding twelve  
9    thousand five hundred and seventy-three dollars and  
10   forty-seven cents. [Res. 1856, chap. 74.]

11 For printing blanks and circulars, and the calendar  
12 of orders of the day for the use of the senate, a sum  
13 not exceeding three hundred and eleven dollars and  
14 forty-seven cents. [Res. 1856, chap. 74.]

15 For printing blanks and circulars, and the calendar  
16 of orders of the day for the house of representatives,  
17 a sum not exceeding two hundred and seventeen dol-  
18 lars and seven cents. [Res. 1856, chap. 74.]

19 For stationery for the senate, purchased by the  
20 clerk of the senate, a sum not exceeding one hundred  
21 and two dollars and eighty-one cents. [Res. 1856,  
22 chap. 74.]

23 For contingent expenses of the senate and house of  
24 representatives, a sum not exceeding one thousand  
25 and thirty-two dollars and seventy-two cents. [Gen.  
26 Stat. chap 14, § 62.]

#### STATE PRINTING.

27 For printing and binding the public series of docu-  
28 ments in the last quarter of the year eighteen hundred  
29 and sixty-eight, a sum not exceeding two thousand  
30 eight hundred and thirty dollars and fifteen cents.  
31 [Gen. Stat. chap. 4.]

32 For printing the pamphlet edition of the general  
33 acts and resolves of the year eighteen hundred and  
34 sixty-nine, a sum not exceeding two thousand one  
35 hundred and fifteen dollars and forty-seven cents.  
36 [Gen. Stat. chap. 3; Acts 1866, chap. 65.]

37 For printing and binding the "blue book" edition  
38 of the acts and resolves of the year eighteen hundred  
39 and sixty-nine, a sum not exceeding two hundred and  
40 seventy-three dollars and eighty-nine cents. [Gen.  
41 Stat. chap. 3.]

## MISCELLANEOUS.

42 For repairs, improvements and furniture of the  
43 state house for the year eighteen hundred and sixty-  
44 nine, a sum not exceeding two thousand four hun-  
45 dred and thirty-nine dollars and ten cents; and for  
46 the year eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, a sum not  
47 exceeding twenty-nine dollars and fifty-three cents.

49 For incidental expenses of the secretary's depart-  
50 ment, a sum not exceeding one thousand two hundred  
51 and seventy-four dollars and forty-one cents. [Gen.  
52 Stat. chap. 14.]

53 For incidental expenses of the auditor's depart-  
54 ment, a sum not exceeding two hundred and thirty-  
55 two dollars and forty cents. [Acts 1867, chap. 178.]

56 For fees, costs and court expenses of the attorney-  
57 general, and for incidental and contingent expenses  
58 of the attorney-general's department, a sum not ex-  
59 ceeding three hundred and fifty-four dollars and  
60 eighty cents. [Gen. Stat. chap. 14.]

61 For militia bounty, a sum not exceeding seven  
62 thousand two hundred and fifty-four dollars and nine-  
63 ty-five cents. [Acts 1866, chap. 219; 1867, 266.]

64 For military accounts, a sum not exceeding one  
65 thousand five hundred and eighty-one dollars and  
66 ninety-two cents. [Acts 1866, chap. 219; 1867, 266.]

67 For expenses of the visiting agency of the board  
68 of state charities, a sum not exceeding seven hundred  
69 and ninety-four dollars and sixty-six cents. [Acts  
70 1869, chapter 453.]

71 For expenses of the secretary of the board of agri-  
72 culture, a sum not exceeding one hundred and

73 twenty-eight dollars and ninety-eight cents. [Gen.  
74 Stat. chap. 16.]

75 For the personal expenses of the members of the  
76 board of agriculture, a sum not exceeding two  
77 hundred and fifty dollars. [Gen. Stat. chap. 16.]

78 For expenses of the cattle commissioners ap-  
79 pointed in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-  
80 eight, a sum not exceeding twenty-five dollars. [Res.  
81 1866, chap. 17.]

82 For compensation and expenses of the harbor  
83 commissioners, a sum not exceeding two thousand  
84 nine hundred and fifty-six dollars. [Acts 1866,  
85 chap. 149.]

86 For the current expenses of the Massachusetts  
87 nautical school, a sum not exceeding four hundred  
88 and ninety-six dollars and sixty-nine cents. [Gen.  
89 Stat. chap. 76.]

90 The unexpended balance of the appropriation made  
91 in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, for  
92 the compensation and expenses of the commissioners  
93 on Cape Cod harbor, amounting to twenty-three  
94 thousand thirty-five dollars and eighty-five cents, is  
95 hereby reappropriated for the same purposes.

97 For valuation books for the year eighteen hundred  
98 sixty-nine, a sum not exceeding one thousand eight  
99 hundred and sixty-nine dollars and twenty-five cents.

101 For incidental and contingent expenses of the rail-  
102 road commissioners, a sum not exceeding six hun-  
102 dred and eighteen dollars and forty-eight cents.
