### AN ACT

Authorizing the Town of Dartmouth to discontinue  
a private Burial-Ground.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1    SECT. 1. The selectmen of the town of Dart-  
2 mouth are hereby authorized to discontinue a  
3 private burial-ground on the "Briggs Farm," so  
4 called, in said town, and cause the remains there  
5 interred to be removed to a common burial place.

1    SECT. 2. The title to the ground used as such  
2 private burial place shall vest in and be confirmed  
3 to the present owners of said "Briggs Farm."

1    SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
