In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty-six.

AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Compensation and Mileage of Officers and Men of the Volunteer Militia, and for other Expenses of the Military Department.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-
6 ber in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-six,
7 to wit:—

8 For the compensation of officers and men of the
9 volunteer militia, a sum not exceeding eighty
10 thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 14, sect.
11 130; Acts 1884, chap. 230.]

12 For transportation of officers and men of the
13 volunteer militia, while on military duty, a sum
14 not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars. [Pub.
15 Stat., chap. 14, sect. 131; Acts 1884, chap. 230.]

16 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
17 adjutant-general's department, a sum not exceed-
18 ing three thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap.
19 14; Res. 1856, chap. 74.]

20 For rent of brigade and battalion headquarters
21 and company armories, a sum not exceeding thir-
22 ty-one thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 14,
23 sects. 92-99.]

24 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
25 quartermaster-general's department, a sum not
26 exceeding five thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat.,
27 chap. 14, sect. 14.]

28 For quartermaster's supplies, a sum not exceed-
29 ing ten thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 14,
30 sect. 14.]

31 For grading and care of the camp ground of
32 the Commonwealth, at Framingham, a sum not
33 exceeding one thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat.,
34 chap. 14, sect. 14.]

35 For military accounts in connection with the
36 volunteer militia, not otherwise provided for, a
37 sum not exceeding four thousand dollars. [Pub.
38 Stat., chap. 14, sects. 131, 135 and 136.]

39 For medical supplies for the use of the volun-
40 teer militia, a sum not exceeding five hundred
41 dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 14, sect. 17.]

42 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
43 surgeon-general, a sum not exceeding five hun-

44 dred dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 14, sect. 17; Res.
45 1856, chap. 74.]

46 For expenses in connection with the record of
47 Massachusetts officers, sailors and marines, a
48 sum not exceeding one thousand five hundred
49 dollars. [Res. 1875, chap. 15; 1880, chap. 8.]

50 Any sums of money received under the provi-
51 sions of section eighty-eight of chapter fourteen of
52 the Public Statutes, and from the sale of grass at
53 the state camp ground, may be expended by the
54 quartermaster-general, under the direction of the
55 governor and council, for the purchase of other
56 military supplies, and for the care and improve-
57 ment of said ground.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
