In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty-six.

AN ACT

To give Selectmen of Towns the Power to remove
Engineers of Fire Departments.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Section twenty-nine of chapter thirty-five of
2 the Public Statutes is amended by inserting after
3 the word "stead" the words, "but the selectmen
4 may, for cause, remove from office any engineer,
5 after seven days' notice to him [A.]," so that said
6 section shall read as follows: "The selectmen of
7 such town shall annually in April appoint for
8 such department as many engineers, not exceed-

9 ing twelve, as they may think expedient, for the
10 term of one year from the first day of May fol-
11 lowing, and until others are appointed in their
12 stead, but the selectmen may, for cause, remove
13 from office any engineer, after seven days' notice
14 to him [B.]; and the selectmen shall fill all va-
15 cancies."
