### AN ACT

To Incorporate the Montgomery Light Guard Veteran Association.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Thomas F. Doherty, Michael H.  
2 Enwright, Thomas F. Ferris, William A. Collins,  
3 Patrick A. Hartnett, John J. Murphy, their asso-  
4 ciates and successors, are hereby made a corpora-  
5 tion by the name of the Montgomery Light Guard  
6 Veteran Association.

1 SECT. 2. The objects of this corporation shall  
2 be to afford pecuniary relief to aged, reduced and  
3 indigent members, and to their widows and chil-  
4 dren; to preserve the traditions and customs of  
5 the above named corps; to promote its welfare,  
6 and to continue and foster its friendships and  
7 associations.

1 SECT. 3. The said corporation shall have  
2 power to adopt a constitution and by-laws, rules  
3 and regulations for the admission of members and  
4 their government, the election of officers and pre-  
5 scribing their duty, the suspending and expelling  
6 of members, and for the safe keeping of its prop-  
7 erty and funds, and from time to time to alter or  
8 repeal such constitution, by-laws, rules and regu-  
9 lations.

1 SECT. 4. The said corporation shall have  
2 power to hold property, real and personal, to an  
3 amount not exceeding twenty-five thousand dol-  
4 lars.

1 SECT. 5. The members of said corporation  
2 may parade in public with side arms.

1 SECT. 6. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
