AN ACT

To provide for the Charge of Certain Public Lands.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The harbor and land commission-
2 ers shall have charge of all the lands and rights
3 in lands belonging to the Commonwealth, where-
4 ever the same are situate, except those for which
5 other provision is made by law, and shall have
6 the same powers and duties in respect to such
7 lands which they now have or may hereafter
8 have under general laws in respect to lands,
9 flats, shores and rights in tide waters belonging
10 to the Commonwealth.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
