AN ACT

In relation to the Service of Warrants and Other
Criminal Process.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

- 1 Warrants and other criminal processes issued
- 2 for the apprehension of persons charged with of-
- 3 fences may be directed to, and served by, any
- 4 officer authorized to serve criminal process in any
- 5 county.
