AN ACT

To prohibit the Shooting of Wild Fowl in the
Waters in and around Nantucket.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Whoever shoots at or kills any
2 wild fowl, or any of the so-called shore, marsh
3 or beach birds from boats in the harbor and great
4 ponds of Nantucket, and the waters in and around
5 the islands of Tuckernuck, Muskegat and the
6 Gravelly Islands, shall be punished for each of-
7 fence by a fine of twenty dollars.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
