## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

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In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty-six.

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### AN ACT

In further Addition to the Several Acts making Appropriations for Expenses authorized the Present Year, and for Certain Other Expenses authorized by Law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
- 2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury
- 3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
- 4 for the purposes specified in certain acts and re-
- 5 solves of the present year, and to meet certain
- 6 other expenses authorized by law, to wit:—
- 7 For William E. Cunningham, the sum of two
- 8 hundred dollars, as authorized by chapter fifty-
- 9 four of the resolves of the present year.
- 10 For increasing the number of cells at the state

11 prison at Boston, a sum not exceeding forty-five  
12 thousand dollars, as authorized by chapter fifty-  
13 five of the resolves of the present year.

14 For the town of Ashland, the sum of two hun-  
15 dred and sixty-six dollars and seventy-seven cents,  
16 as authorized by chapter fifty-six of the resolves  
17 of the present year.

18 For the care of the rooms occupied by the  
19 bureau of statistics of labor, a sum not exceeding  
20 five hundred dollars, as authorized by chapter  
21 fifty-seven of the resolves of the present year,  
22 being in addition to the two thousand five hun-  
23 dred dollars appropriated in chapter nineteen of  
24 the acts of the present year.

25 For Z. K. Harmon, the sum of eighty dollars,  
26 as authorized by chapter fifty-nine of the resolves  
27 of the present year.

28 For certain improvements and repairs at the  
29 Massachusetts agricultural college at Amherst, a  
30 sum not exceeding seven thousand dollars, as au-  
31 thorized by chapter sixty of the resolves of the  
32 present year.

33 For Cynthia G. Melvin, the sum of two hun-  
34 dred and twenty-one dollars and twenty-two  
35 cents, as authorized by chapter sixty-one of the  
36 resolves of the present year.

37 For John F. Wallace, the sum of two hundred  
38 dollars, as authorized by chapter sixty-two of the  
39 resolves of the present year.

40 For the erection of hospital buildings at the  
41 state almshouse at Tewksbury, a sum not exceed-  
42 ing seventy-five thousand dollars, as authorized

43 by chapter sixty-three of the resolves of the pres-  
44 ent year.

45 For Benjamin C. Lincoln, the sum of two hun-  
46 dred and twenty-four dollars, as authorized by  
47 chapter sixty-four of the resolves of the present  
48 year.

49 For printing copies of a portion of the seven-  
50 teenth report of the bureau of statistics of labor  
51 relating to profit sharing, a sum not exceeding  
52 one hundred dollars, as authorized by chapter  
53 sixty-five of the resolves of the present year.

54 For the town of Lee, the sum of three thou-  
55 sand dollars, as authorized by chapter sixty-six of  
56 the resolves of the present year.

57 For William D. Dennis, the sum of four hun-  
58 dred dollars, as authorized by chapter sixty-seven  
59 of the resolves of the present year.

60 For painting a portrait of lieutenant-governor  
61 William Dummer, a sum not exceeding three  
62 hundred dollars, as authorized by chapter seventy-  
63 one of the resolves of the present year.

64 For the town of Ludlow, the sum of sixty-five  
65 dollars and eighty-two cents, as authorized by  
66 chapter seventy-two of the resolves of the present  
67 year.

68 For the salary of the adjutant-general, the sum  
69 of five hundred dollars, as authorized by chapter  
70 two hundred and thirty-seven of the acts of the  
71 present year, being in addition to the twenty-five  
72 hundred dollars appropriated by chapter one of  
73 the acts of the present year.

74 For the salary of the first clerk in the adju-

75 tant-general's department, the sum of two hun-  
76 dred dollars, as authorized by chapter two hundred  
77 and thirty-seven of the acts of the present year,  
78 being in addition to the eighteen hundred dollars  
79 appropriated by chapter one of the acts of the  
80 present year.

81 For the salary of the second clerk in the office  
82 of the secretary of the Commonwealth, the sum  
83 of two hundred dollars, as authorized by chapter  
84 two hundred and thirty-eight of the acts of the  
85 present year, being in addition to the fifteen hun-  
86 dred dollars appropriated by chapter one of the  
87 acts of the present year.

88 For the salaries of the commissioners of savings  
89 banks, the sum of two hundred and thirty-seven  
90 dollars and sixty-four cents, as authorized by  
91 chapter two hundred and fifty-two of the acts of  
92 the present year, being in addition to the fifty-six  
93 hundred dollars appropriated by chapter one of  
94 the acts of the present year.

95 For the salary of the first clerk of the commis-  
96 sioners of savings banks, the sum of one hundred  
97 and eighteen dollars and eighty-two cents, as  
98 authorized by chapter two hundred and fifty-two  
99 of the acts of the present year, being in addition  
100 to the thirteen hundred dollars appropriated by  
101 chapter one of the acts of the present year.

102 For the salary of the second clerk of the com-  
103 missioners of savings banks, the sum of one  
104 hundred and eighteen dollars and eighty-two  
105 cents, as authorized by chapter two hundred and

106 fifty-two of the acts of the present year, being in  
107 addition to the seven hundred dollars appropri-  
108 ated for an extra clerk in said department by  
109 chapter one of the acts of the present year, which  
110 said seven hundred dollars is hereby made appli-  
111 cable for the payment of the salary of the second  
112 clerk established as aforesaid.

113 For expenses in connection with "an act to  
114 provide for a state board of arbitration for the  
115 settlement of differences between employers and  
116 their employees", a sum not exceeding five  
117 thousand dollars, as authorized by chapter two  
118 hundred and sixty-three of the acts of the pres-  
119 ent year.

120 For expenses in connection with the "act to  
121 protect the purity of inland waters", a sum not  
122 exceeding four thousand dollars, as authorized  
123 by chapter two hundred and seventy-four of the  
124 acts of the present year.

125 For the salary of the secretary of the board of  
126 commissioners of prisons, the sum of two hun-  
127 dred and eighty dollars and ninety-two cents, as  
128 authorized by chapter two hundred and seventy-  
129 five of the acts of the present year, being in  
130 addition to the two thousand dollars appropriated  
131 by chapter one of the acts of the present year.

132 For the Massachusetts school for the feeble-  
133 minded, the sum of fifteen thousand dollars, as  
134 authorized by chapter two hundred and ninety-  
135 eight of the acts of the present year.

136 For doorkeepers, messengers and pages to the

137 present legislature, a sum not exceeding two  
138 thousand dollars, being in addition to the  
139 amount heretofore appropriated for that pur-  
140 pose.

141 For the compensation of the commissioners  
142 appointed to abate a nuisance at the state nor-  
143 mal school at Bridgewater, such sum as the  
144 governor and council may allow not exceeding  
145 five thousand dollars, as authorized by chapter  
146 two hundred and sixty-six of the acts of the  
147 year eighteen hundred and eighty-three.

148 For providing cities and towns with ballot  
149 boxes, a sum not exceeding five thousand  
150 dollars.

151 For blank books for the registration of voters,  
152 as provided for in section twenty-two of chapter  
153 two hundred and ninety-eight of the acts of the  
154 year eighteen hundred and eighty-four, a sum  
155 not exceeding five hundred dollars.

156 For expenses in connection with contested  
157 election cases, a sum not exceeding two hundred  
158 dollars, as authorized by chapter thirty-six of  
159 the resolves of the present year.

160 For expenses of committees of the present  
161 legislature, a sum not exceeding three thousand  
162 dollars, being in addition to the amounts hereto-  
163 fore appropriated.

164 For expenses in connection with abating a  
165 nuisance at the state normal school at Bridge-  
166 water, the sum of eight hundred and twenty  
167 dollars and sixty-two cents.

168 For the purpose of extending proper courtes-  
169 ies to the President of the United States,  
170 should he visit the state this year, a sum not  
171 exceeding twenty thousand dollars, to be ex-  
172 pended under the direction of the governor, as  
173 authorized by a joint order of the legislature  
174 adopted June twenty-fourth of the present  
175 year.

176 To enable the governor and council to employ  
177 counsel to assist in the defence of actions  
178 brought to recover national bank taxes paid to  
179 a city or town, as authorized by chapter three  
180 hundred and thirty-two of the acts of the pres-  
181 ent year, a sum not exceeding five thousand  
182 dollars.

183 For Edward C. Hawkes of Charlemont, the  
184 sum of three thousand five hundred and forty-  
185 three dollars, as authorized by chapter seventy-  
186 four of the resolves of the present year.

187 For the salary of the first clerk in the depart-  
188 ment of the treasurer and receiver-general,  
189 the sum of one hundred and three dollars and  
190 thirty-three cents, as authorized by chapter  
191 three hundred and thirty-four of the acts of  
192 the present year, being in addition to the  
193 twenty-three hundred dollars appropriated by  
194 chapter one of the acts of the present year.

195 For the salary of the second clerk in the de-  
196 partment of the treasurer and receiver-general,  
197 the sum of one hundred and three dollars and  
198 thirty-three cents, as authorized by chapter



199 three hundred and thirty-four of the acts of the  
200 present year, being in addition to the eighteen  
201 hundred dollars appropriated by chapter one of  
202 the acts of the present year.

203 For the salary of the cashier in the depart-  
204 ment of the treasurer and receiver-general, the  
205 sum of one hundred and three dollars and thirty-  
206 three cents, as authorized by chapter three hun-  
207 dred and thirty-four of the acts of the present  
208 year, being in addition to the eighteen hundred  
209 dollars appropriated by chapter one of the acts  
210 of the present year.

211 For the salary of the third clerk in the depart-  
212 ment of the treasurer and receiver-general, the  
213 sum of one hundred and three dollars and thirty-  
214 three cents, as authorized by chapter three hun-  
215 dred and thirty-four of the acts of the present  
216 year, being in addition to the twelve hundred  
217 dollars appropriated by chapters one and one  
218 hundred and forty-one of the acts of the present  
219 year.

220 For the salary of the fund clerk in the depart-  
221 ment of the treasurer and receiver-general, the  
222 sum of one hundred and three dollars and thirty-  
223 three cents, as authorized by chapter three hun-  
224 dred and thirty-four of the acts of the present  
225 year, being in addition to the twelve hundred  
226 dollars appropriated by chapters one and one  
227 hundred and forty-one of the acts of the present  
228 year.

229 For the salary of the receiving-teller in the

230 department of the treasurer and receiver-general,  
231 the sum of one hundred and three dollars and  
232 thirty-three cents, as authorized by chapter three  
233 hundred and thirty-four of the acts of the present  
234 year, being in addition to the twelve hundred  
235 dollars appropriated by chapters one and one  
236 hundred and forty-one of the acts of the present  
237 year.

238 For expenses in connection with preparing and  
239 publishing a new index of the Public Statutes,  
240 a sum not exceeding twenty-five hundred dol-  
241 lars, as authorized by chapter seventy-five of the  
242 resolves of the present year.

243 For the town of Russell, one hundred and  
244 seventy-six dollars and sixty-eight cents, as  
245 authorized by chapter seventy-seven of the  
246 resolves of the present year.

247 For certain repairs at the state house and  
248 Commonwealth building, a sum not exceeding  
249 eighteen thousand dollars, as authorized by  
250 chapter seventy-eight of the resolves of the  
251 present year.

252 For the widow of the late Jesse B. Wheeler,  
253 the sum of seven hundred and fifty-six dollars,  
254 as authorized by chapter eighty of the resolves  
255 of the present year.

256 For Lucretia D. Durgin, administratrix, the  
257 sum of four hundred and fifty-nine dollars and  
258 sixty-three cents, as authorized by chapter  
259 eighty-one of the resolves of the present year.

260 For providing accommodations for various new

261 commissions and additional rooms for other de-  
262 partments, a sum not exceeding eight thousand  
263 dollars.

264 For aiding prisoners discharged from the  
265 Massachusetts reformatory, a sum not exceeding  
266 fifteen hundred dollars, as authorized by chapter  
267 eighty-four of the resolves of the present year.

1    SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
