Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty-eight.

AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Compensation and Mileage of the Members of the Legislature, for the Compensation of Officers thereof, and for Expenses in Connection therewith.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
- 2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury
- 3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
- 4 for the purposes specified, to wit: —
- 5 For compensation of senators, thirty thousand
- 6 seven hundred and fifty dollars. [Acts 1886,
- 7 chap. 352.]
- 8 For mileage of senators, a sum not exceeding
- 9 four hundred and fifty dollars. [Acts 1886, chap.
- 10 352.]
- 11 For compensation of representatives, one hun-
- 12 dred and eighty thousand seven hundred and fifty
- 13 dollars. [Acts 1886, chap. 352.]

14 For mileage of representatives, a sum not
15 exceeding two thousand five hundred dollars.

16 [Acts 1886, chap. 352.]

17 For compensation of the chaplains of the senate
18 and house of representatives, three hundred dol-
19 lars each. [Pub. Stat., chap. 2, sect. 23.]

20 For the salaries of the doorkeepers of the sen-
21 ate and house of representatives, fourteen hun-
22 dred dollars each. [Acts 1887, chap. 116.]

23 For compensation of the assistant doorkeepers,
24 postmaster, messengers and pages to the senate
25 and house of representatives, a sum not exceed-
26 ing twenty-three thousand one hundred dollars.
27 [Acts 1887, chap. 116.]

28 For contingent expenses of the senate and
29 house of representatives, and necessary expenses
30 in and about the state house, a sum not exceed-
31 ing seven thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 5;
32 Acts 1887, chap. 128.]

33 For expenses of summoning witnesses before
34 committees and for fees for such witnesses, a sum
35 not exceeding two hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat.,
36 chap. 16, sects. 46 and 47.]

37 For authorized expenses of committees of the
38 present legislature, to include clerical assistance
39 to committees authorized to employ the same, a
40 sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars. [Pub.
41 Stat., chap. 16.]

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
