AN ACT

To incorporate the Spencer Farmers' and Mechanics' Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Charles N. Prouty, George Wil-
2 son, Henry R. Green, Thomas J. Comins, and
3 their associates and successors within the towns
4 of Spencer, Leicester, Paxton, Oakham, Brook-
5 field, North Brookfield and Charlton, are hereby
6 made a corporation under the name of the Spen-
7 cer Farmers' and Mechanics' Association, to be
8 located at Spencer for the encouragement of
9 agriculture, horticulture and the arts, by pre-
10 miums and other means, with the powers and
11 privileges and subject to all the duties, restric-
12 tions and liabilities set forth in all general laws
13 which now are or may hereafter be in force

14 applicable to such corporations; and said corpora-
15 tion is hereby authorized to hold, by purchase,
16 gift, devise or otherwise, real and personal estate
17 to an amount not exceeding twenty-five thousand
18 dollars.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
