### AN ACT

To confirm the Proceedings of a Meeting of the  
Town of Hyde Park.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows.*

1 SECTION 1. The proceedings of the town of  
2 Hyde Park at a town meeting of said town held  
3 on the twenty-fifth day of April in the year  
4 eighteen hundred eighty-eight, shall not be  
5 invalid by reason of any defect in the warrant  
6 calling said meeting, nor failure to warn the same  
7 according to law; and, notwithstanding that by  
8 the by-laws of said town the annual town meet-  
9 ing for appropriations shall be held between the  
10 first Monday in March and the first Monday in  
11 April of each year, the doings of said meeting are  
12 made legal and ratified and confirmed.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
