AN ACT

Relative to the Discharge of Persons appointed
under the Civil Service Law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Section four of chapter three hundred and
2 twenty of the acts of the year eighteen hundred
3 and eighty-four shall be amended to read as fol-
4 lows: *Sect. 4.* No person shall be appointed to
5 or employed in any office to which the provisions
6 of this act are applicable within one year after
7 his conviction of any offence against the laws of
8 this Commonwealth.
