AMENDED NOTICE OF ACTION

RE: Alexander B. Bruce School, Multiple Locations Curb Cuts, Lawrence

An application for variance was filed with the Board by John Rockwell, PE (Applicant) on July 12, 2017.

The applicant has requested variances from the following sections of the 2006 Rules and Regulations of the Board:

Section: Description:

21.3 Petitioner seeks relief for the center slope of certain curb cut locations at Milton St., Lowell St., Providence St., and Buttler Street located in Lawrence MA.

On October 20, 2017 Jonathan Rockwell P.E. submitted an amendment to Docket V17-198. The amendment submitted helped to clarify the location of each variance being requested. There are 18 locations that the petitioner seeks relief for Section 21.3

2. The submittal was reviewed by the Board on Monday, October 30, 2017
3. After reviewing all materials submitted to the Board, the Board voted as follows:

GRANT: the variance relief for Section 21.3 for the 18 different locations referenced in question number 6 of the amended application submitted on October 20, 2017 by Jonathan Rockwell P.E. and as proposed in the application submitted, for the reason that impracticability (see definitions of impracticability in Section 5 of 521 CMR) has been proven in this case.

Any person aggrieved by the above decision may request an adjudicatory hearing before the Board within 30 days of receipt of this decision by filing the attached request for an adjudicatory hearing. If after 30 days, a request for an adjudicatory hearing is not received, the above decision becomes a final decision and the appeal process is through Superior Court.
