AN ACT

Concerning the Appointment of Appraisers in Civil Pro-
cess.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
tives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of
the same, as follows :*

1 SECT. 1. The act entitled "an act for the appoint-
2 ment of appraisers in civil process," approved May
3 24th, 1851, is hereby repealed.

1 SECT. 2. No appraisement, made since the said
2 act took effect, shall be invalid for want of conform-
3 ity to the provisions thereof, provided the same were
4 made in conformity to the provisions of law existing
5 previously to the passage of said act.

1 SECT. 3. Wherever appraisers are appointed by
2 virtue of the provisions of law relating to any civil
3 process in the hands of any officer authorized to
4 serve the same, such appraisers may be sworn by
5 said officer.

1 SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from and after
2 its passage.
