### Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-  
Two.

### AN ACT

To Incorporate the South Boston Gas Light Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :*

1    SECT. 1. William T. Andrews, T. B. Wales, Jr.,  
2 Francis Alger, J. N. Moore, and John H. Blake,  
3 the'r associates and successors are hereby made a cor-  
4 poration, by the name of the South Boston Gas Light

5 Company, for the purpose of manufacturing and sell-  
6 ing gas in the city of Boston, with all the powers  
7 and privileges, and subject to all the duties, restric-  
8 tions, and liabilities set forth in the thirty-eighth and  
9 forty-fourth chapters of the Revised Statutes.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation may for the purpose  
2 aforesaid, hold real estate not exceeding in value  
3 three hundred thousand dollars, and the whole cap-  
4 ital stock shall not exceed five hundred thousand dol-  
5 lars.

1 SECT. 3. Said corporation, with the consent of the  
2 Mayor and Aldermen of the city of Boston, shall have  
3 power and authority to open the ground in any part  
4 of the streets, lanes, and highways in the said city,  
5 for the purpose of sinking and repairing such pipes  
6 and conductors as it may be necessary to sink for the  
7 purpose aforesaid, and the said corporation, after  
8 opening the ground in such streets, lanes, or high-  
9 ways, shall be held to put the same again into repair  
10 under the penalty of being prosecuted for a nuisance :  
11 *provided*, that the said Mayor and Aldermen, for the  
12 time being, shall at all times have the power to regu-  
13 late, restrict, and control the acts and doings of the  
14 said corporation, which may in any manner affect the  
15 health, safety, or convenience of the inhabitants of  
16 said city.

1 SECT. 4. No shares in the capital stock of the  
2 said corporation shall be issued for a less sum or  
3 amount, to be actually paid in on each, than the par  
4 value of the shares which shall first be issued.

1 SECT. 5. This Act shall take effect from and after  
2 its passage.

## AN ACT

To Amend the Laws of Massachusetts upon the Subject  
 of the Communitarianism

It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
 in General Court assembled, and by the authority of  
 the same, as follows:

1. That any Court in the Commonwealth that  
 2. shall have rendered judgment on any case, the  
 3. result of which has been referred to the Common-  
 4. wealth, may grant a review of such judgment and a  
 5. rehearing of the case, on the petition of any party or  
 6. person interested to have such judgment revised and
