AN ACT

In addition to the several Acts for the relief of Insolvent Debtors, and the more equal distribution of their effects.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1 SECT. 1. So much of the fourth section of chapter
2 304 of the statutes of 1848, as requires the commis-
3 sioners of insolvency appointed under said act to hold
4 a court in the shire town of their respective counties
5 on the first Tuesday of every month, is hereby re-
6 pealed.

1 SECT. 2. No person shall act as counsel or attor-
 2 ney in any case pending before a commissioner of
 3 insolvency, judge of probate, or other judicial officer,
 4 in which such person is clerk or register.

1 SECT. 3. If any person shall be guilty of a viola-
 2 tion of the provision contained in the second section
 3 of this act, he shall forthwith be removed from his
 4 said office of clerk or register.

 5 on the first Tuesday of every month, is hereby re-
 6 pealed.
