### AN ACT

To Authorize Timothy P. Johnson to construct a Railroad  
Track in the Town of Provincetown.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows :*

1   SECT. 1. Timothy P. Johnson, the proprietor of a  
2 wharf in the town of Provincetown, for the purpose  
3 of facilitating the transportation of earth to said  
4 wharf, is hereby authorized to construct and maintain  
5 a railroad track across a public street adjoining said  
6 wharf, between such points and in such direction as  
7 shall be approved by the selectmen of said town of  
8 Provincetown.

1   SECT. 2. A good and sufficient crossing at said  
2 street or highway, for teams and carriages, shall be

3 maintained by the said Johnson; and in arranging  
4 the same, he shall be subject to such rules and re-  
5 quirements as by the said selectmen of the town of  
6 Provincetown may be deemed reasonable and neces-  
7 sary.
