AN ACT

To incorporate the Framingham Hotel Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. James W. Clark, C. C. Esty, Francis
2 Jaques, their associates and successors, are hereby
3 made a corporation by the name of the Framingham
4 Hotel Company, for the purpose of erecting a hotel
5 in the town of Framingham, and maintaining the
6 same, and the buildings and appurtenances connected
7 therewith; with all the powers and privileges, and
8 subject to all the duties, liabilities and restrictions, set
9 forth in the forty-fourth chapter of the Revised Stat-
10 utes.

1 SECT. 2. The whole amount of real and personal
2 estate, or capital stock, which said corporation may
3 hold for the purposes aforesaid, shall not exceed fifty
4 thousand dollars: *provided*, that no shares in the cap-
5 ital stock of said corporation shall be issued for a less
6 sum or amount to be actually paid in on each, than
7 the par value of the shares which shall be first issued;
8 and *provided, also*, that said corporation shall not
9 carry on the business of hotel-keeping.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after
2 its passage.
