AN ACT

To incorporate the "Boston Union Coal Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. John L. Porter, Samuel D. Fuller, their
2 associates and successors, are hereby made and consti-
3 tuted a corporation, under the name and style of the
4 "Boston Union Coal Company," with all the powers
5 and privileges, and subject to all the duties and re-
6 quirements, contained in the forty-fourth chapter of
7 the Revised Statutes.

1 SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation
2 shall amount to one hundred and fifty thousand dol-
3 lars; and said corporation may organize and go into

4 operation, whenever one-third of said stock shall have
5 been taken up and paid into the treasury of said
6 company.

1 SECT. 3. The stock of said company shall be
2 divided into shares of one hundred dollars each.

1 SECT. 4. Said company shall have power to pur-
2 chase and sell all the various kinds of hard and soft
3 coal and wood; and they shall sell their coal and
4 wood at a price not exceeding an advance of five per
5 centum upon the actual cost of the same, including
6 all outlay, disbursements and expenses attending the
7 purchase and sale of the same.
