AN ACT

To incorporate the Eliot City Mission Society, of Roxbury.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. Henry Hill, A. C. Thompson, Alvah
2 Kittredge, William W. Davenport, Benjamin Per-
3 kins, Hamilton A. Hill, E. B. Huntington and Oliver
4 L. Gridley, their associates and successors, are hereby
5 made a corporation by the name of the Eliot City
6 Mission Society, in the city of Roxbury, with all the
7 powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties,
8 liabilities and restrictions, set forth in the forty-fourth
9 chapter of the Revised Statutes.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold real and per-
2 sonal estate to an amount not exceeding ten thousand
3 dollars, for charitable purposes, and the promotion of
4 religion and morality.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after
2 its passage.
