### AN ACT

To abolish the Land Office.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—*

1    SECT. 1. The land office established for the man-  
2    agement and sale of land, belonging to this Common-  
3    wealth, in the State of Maine, is hereby abolished.

1    SECT. 2. The treasurer and receiver-general of the  
2    Commonwealth shall, hereafter, have and exercise all  
3    the powers now by law conferred upon, and perform  
4    all the duties now by law required of the land agent.

1    SECT. 3. The first section of the tenth chapter of  
2    the Revised Statutes, the first section of the two hun-  
3    dred and nineteenth chapter of the acts of the year  
4    one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, the first

5 and second sections of the one hundred and nine-  
6 tieth chapter of the acts of the year one thousand  
7 eight hundred and fifty-one, and all other acts and  
8 parts of acts inconsistent herewith, are hereby re-  
9 pealed: *provided*, that this repeal shall not be con-  
10 strued to revive any acts or parts of acts repealed in  
11 or by any of the acts herein referred to.

1     SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from and after  
2 the first day of January, in the year one thousand  
3 eight hundred and fifty-nine.
