The Committee on Fisheries, to whom was referred the Petition of Edmund Smith and others, from the town of Newbury, to regulate the Fishery in Parker River, have considered the matter, and report the accompanying Bill.

AN ACT

In addition to an Act to regulate the Fishery in Newbury.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. If any person shall take any fish in the
2 Parker River, or in any other streams in the town of
3 Newbury, at any time, or in any manner, other than
4 shall be allowed by the town under the provisions of
5 the act passed April eighteenth, in the year one thou-
6 sand eight hundred and thirty-seven, to which this
7 act is an addition, he shall, for such offence, on con-
8 viction thereof, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding
9 one dollar for each fish so taken; to be recovered in
10 any court proper to try the same, to the use of him
11 who shall prosecute therefor: *provided, however,* that
12 nothing contained in this act shall be so construed as

13 to prohibit any inhabitant of the town of Rowley
14 from taking fish in that part of the branch of Parker
15 River, called Mill River which constitutes the divid-
16 ing line, in part, between the towns of Newbury and
17 Rowley.

1 SECT. 2. The third section of the laws of the year
2 one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, chapter
3 one hundred and ninety-five, is hereby repealed.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after
2 its passage.
