AN ACT

To protect Cut Beach, in the Town of Gloucester.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. No person shall carry away or remove,
2 by land or water, any sand, stones, gravel or dirt,
3 from the beach lying south of and adjoining Western
4 Avenue, formerly Canal Street, in the town of Glouces-
5 ter, extending from the old Fort to the upland of
6 Benjamin K. Hough and others, without permission
7 first obtained from the selectmen of said town of
8 Gloucester, or from some person or persons duly
9 authorized by the selectmen of said town to grant
10 such permission.

1 SECT. 2. Any person who shall offend against any
2 of the provisions of this act, shall forfeit and pay for
3 each offence a sum not exceeding twenty dollars, to
4 be recovered by complaint or indictment in any court
5 of competent jurisdiction, one-half for the use of the
6 complainant, the other half for the use of said town
7 of Gloucester.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after
2 its passage.
