---

### AN ACT

Making Appropriations from the Income of several Trust Funds therein mentioned, and for other purposes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—*

- 1    SECT. 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned in this  
2 section, are appropriated and shall be allowed and  
3 paid, out of the moiety of the income of the school  
4 fund applicable to educational purposes, on the war-  
5 rant of the governor, for the year one thousand eight  
6 hundred and fifty-nine, including also unpaid accounts  
7 of preceding years, that is to say:—
- 8    For the support of the four state normal schools,  
9 in accordance with the provisions of the resolves of  
10 the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five,  
11 chapter forty-eight, and the resolves of one thousand  
12 eight hundred and fifty-seven, chapter eighty-five, a

13 sum not exceeding fourteen thousand five hundred  
14 dollars.

15 For the support of one or more agents of the board  
16 of education, in accordance with the provisions of  
17 the resolves of the year one thousand eight hundred  
18 and fifty-seven, chapter twenty-two, a sum not exceed-  
19 ing four thousand two hundred and fifty dollars.

20 For the support of state scholarships, in accordance  
21 with the acts of the year one thousand eight hundred  
22 and fifty-three, chapter one hundred and ninety-three,  
23 four thousand eight hundred dollars.

24 For aid to attendants in the state normal schools,  
25 in accordance with the resolves of the year one thou-  
26 sand eight hundred and fifty-three, chapter sixty-two,  
27 a sum not exceeding four thousand dollars.

28 For the expenses of the secretary of the board of  
29 education, in accordance with the acts of the year  
30 one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, chapter  
31 two hundred and fifteen, section third, a sum not  
32 exceeding four hundred dollars.

33 For expenses of the members of the board of edu-  
34 cation, in accordance with the acts of the year one  
35 thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, chapter fifty-  
36 five, a sum not exceeding two hundred dollars.

37 For the support of certain Indian schools, in  
38 accordance with the Revised Statutes, chapter twenty-  
39 three, section sixty-eight, one hundred dollars; in  
40 accordance with the acts of the year one thousand  
41 eight hundred thirty-eight, chapter one hundred fifty-  
42 four, one hundred forty dollars; in accordance with  
43 the resolves of the year one thousand eight hundred  
44 fifty-five, chapter thirty-five, one hundred sixty-five  
45 dollars; in accordance with the resolves of the year

46 one thousand eight hundred fifty-six, chapter twenty-  
47 eight, one hundred and four dollars; chapter thirty-  
48 four, sixty dollars; and in accordance with a resolve  
49 of the year one thousand eight hundred fifty-nine,  
50 fifty dollars, making in the aggregate six hundred  
51 nineteen dollars.

52 For county associations of teachers, in accordance  
53 with the act of the year one thousand eight hundred  
54 and forty-eight, chapter three hundred and one, a sum  
55 not exceeding seven hundred dollars.

56 For the American Institute of Instruction, in  
57 accordance with the resolves of the year one thousand  
58 eight hundred and fifty-five, chapter thirty-six, three  
59 hundred dollars.

60 For the New England Medical College, in accord-  
61 ance with the resolves of the year one thousand eight  
62 hundred and fifty-four, chapter eighty-five, one thou-  
63 sand dollars.

64 For postage, printing, advertising, stationery, meteo-  
65 rological observations, and all other incidental expenses  
66 of the board of education, or of the secretary  
67 thereof, and also for any expenses of the normal  
68 schools, not otherwise herein provided for, a sum not  
69 exceeding four thousand five hundred dollars.

70 For the salary of the assistant-secretary of the  
71 board of education, one thousand five hundred dollars.

72 For the Massachusetts Teachers' Association, in  
73 accordance with a resolve of the year one thousand  
74 eight hundred and fifty-nine, chapter ,  
75 three hundred dollars.

76 For printing the catalogue of the state library,  
77 the sum of nine hundred thirty-four dollars ninety-  
78 six cents.

1    SECT. 2.   The income of the Indians' School Fund  
2 shall be applied according to the provisions of the  
3 acts of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-  
4 seven, chapter eighty-five, section seven.

1    SECT. 3.   The income of the Todd Normal School  
2 Fund shall be paid to the treasurer of the board of  
3 education, to be applied in such manner as shall be  
4 prescribed by said board.

1    SECT. 4.   The income of the Rogers Book Fund  
2 shall be expended, in accordance with the conditions  
3 named by the donor, in conformity with chapter two  
4 hundred and fifteen of the year one thousand eight  
5 hundred and fifty-seven.

1    SECT. 5.   The sums mentioned in this section are  
2 appropriated, and shall be allowed and paid out of  
3 the Charles River and Warren Bridges Fund, for the  
4 year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, that  
5 is to say:—

6    For the salary of the agent of said bridges, the sum  
7 of five hundred dollars.

8    For repairs on said bridges, and the buildings  
9 belonging thereto, a sum not exceeding nine hundred  
10 dollars.

11   For the compensation of the draw-tenders on said  
12 bridges in conformity with an act of the year one  
13 thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, entitled, "An  
14 Act concerning the agent and draw-tenders of Charles  
15 River and Warren Bridges," a sum not exceeding one  
16 thousand eight hundred dollars.

17 For horse-keeping, a sum not exceeding three hun-  
18 dred dollars.

19 For gas, oil, fluid and fuel, a sum not exceeding six  
20 hundred dollars.

21 For incidental expenses, a sum not exceeding two  
22 hundred dollars.

1 SECT. 6. The sums mentioned in this section are  
2 appropriated, and shall be allowed and paid out of  
3 the moneys arising from the tolls collected on the  
4 Essex Bridge for the year one thousand eight hundred  
5 and fifty-nine, that is to say:—

6 For the salary of the agent of said bridge, the sum  
7 of one hundred dollars.

8 For the compensation of the toll-gatherers and  
9 draw-tenders upon said bridge, a sum not exceeding  
10 five hundred dollars.

11 For the repair and maintenance of said bridge, a  
12 sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.

13 And all moneys arising from the tolls on said  
14 bridge, shall be paid into the state treasury.

1 SECT. 7. In all cases for which no other provision  
2 is made by law, the income, or any surplus thereof, of  
3 all funds belonging to, or in the custody of the Com-  
4 monwealth, shall be added to the principal.

1 SECT. 8. This act shall take effect from and after  
2 its passage.
