### AN ACT

Relating to Poll Taxes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—*

1    SECT. 1. The twenty-seventh section of the seventh  
2 chapter of the Revised Statutes, is so far amended as  
3 to provide that the assessors shall assess upon the  
4 polls, as nearly as the same can be conveniently done,  
5 one-sixth part of the whole sum to be assessed: *pro-*  
6 *vided*, the whole poll tax assessed in any one year  
7 upon any one individual, shall not exceed two dollars  
8 and fifty cents.

1    SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its pas-  
2 sage.
