## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-  
Nine.

### AN ACT

In addition to an Act making Appropriations for certain Expenditures and Deficiencies, and for other purposes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—*

1    SECT. 1.   The sums hereinafter mentioned are  
2    appropriated and shall be allowed and paid out of the  
3    treasury of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary  
4    revenue, upon the warrants of the governor, for the  
5    purposes specified in certain acts and resolves, for the  
6    present year, herein cited, as follows, viz.:—

7    For the mileage and compensation of the lieutenant-  
8    governor and council, in addition to former appropri-  
9    ations, a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars.

10   For the compensation of senators, in addition to  
11   former appropriations, a sum not exceeding four  
12   thousand dollars.

13 For the compensation of representatives, in addition  
14 to former appropriations, a sum not exceeding twenty  
15 thousand dollars.

16 For the salaries of the clerks of the senate and  
17 house of representatives, including the compensation  
18 of such assistants as they may appoint, four thousand  
19 dollars, in addition to former appropriations.

20 For the salaries of the chaplains of the senate and  
21 house of representatives, four hundred dollars, in  
22 addition to former appropriations.

23 For fees of witnesses summoned before committees  
24 having authority to send for persons and papers, a  
25 sum not exceeding three hundred dollars, in addition  
26 to former appropriations.

27 For stationery for the house of representatives pur-  
28 chased by the clerk, which, together with the unex-  
29 pended balance for the regular session, may be used  
30 to meet bills of the extra session, six hundred dollars.

31 For the state library, five hundred dollars, in anti-  
32 cipation of appropriations of eighteen hundred and  
33 sixty, and in addition to former appropriations.

34 For compensation and expenses of the commissioner  
35 on Indians, appointed under chapter two hundred and  
36 sixty-six, of acts of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine,  
37 one thousand dollars.

38 For term reports of cases in supreme court, under  
39 the provisions of chapter two hundred and sixty-five  
40 and two hundred and ninety of the acts of eighteen  
41 hundred and fifty-nine, four thousand dollars.

42 For printing public documents of eighteen hun-  
43 dred and fifty-eight, one hundred dollars.

44 For expenses attending the delivery of Mr. Everett's  
45 oration on Webster, two hundred dollars.

46 For compensation of the persons appointed under  
47 authority of acts of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine,  
48 chapter two hundred and twenty-one, section six, to  
49 countersign circulating notes of the similitude of bank  
50 notes, and the same may be paid to the clerk in the  
51 auditor's office, in addition to his salary, three hundred  
52 dollars.

53 For the support of certain Marshpee Indians, in  
54 addition to the sum allowed in chapter one hundred  
55 of resolves of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, to be  
56 paid from the existing appropriation for Indians,  
57 thirty-nine dollars and eighty-five cents.

58 For expenses of hospital at Rainsford Island, in  
59 addition to amount appropriated in chapter two hun-  
60 dred and seventy-one, acts of eighteen hundred and  
61 fifty-nine, three thousand dollars.

62 For printing, stationery, advertising, postage and  
63 books ordered by the sergeant-at-arms, for the legisla-  
64 ture, in addition to former appropriations, one hun-  
65 dred dollars.

66 For the payment of expenses of the supreme court  
67 for the Commonwealth, according to the provisions of  
68 chapter one hundred and ninety-six of the acts of  
69 eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, four hundred and  
70 ninety-eight dollars and forty-six cents.

71 For binding railroad reports according to chapter  
72 two hundred and sixty-two, acts of eighteen hundred  
73 and fifty-nine, two hundred dollars.

74 For the payment of railroad fare of military com-  
75 panies, according to chapter one hundred and twenty  
76 of resolves of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, eight  
77 hundred dollars.



78 For expenses of Luther Stowell, according to chap-  
79 ter one hundred and fifteen of resolves of eighteen  
80 hundred and fifty-nine, sixty dollars and fifty cents.

81 For compensation of commissioners on consoli-  
82 dating the general statutes, in addition to former  
83 appropriations, twenty thousand dollars.

84 For the compensation of the clerk of the com-  
85 mittee of revision, eleven hundred and fifty dollars.

86 For door-keepers, messengers and pages of the  
87 legislature, five thousand six hundred dollars, being  
88 compensation for services at the extra session.

89 For rebuilding the state reform school for boys,  
90 thirty thousand dollars.

91 For allowance to Lydia Russell and D. F. Crane,  
92 eight hundred and twenty-seven dollars, according to  
93 the provisions of resolves of eighteen hundred and  
94 fifty-nine, chapter .

95 For expenses under chapter ninety-three of the  
96 resolves of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, the sum  
97 of two thousand dollars, the same to be in addition  
98 to sums appropriated under chapter two hundred  
99 and seventy-three of the acts of eighteen hundred  
100 and fifty-nine.

101 For allowance to John P. Bass, according to pro-  
102 visions of resolves of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine,  
103 chapter , seven hundred and fifty dollars.

104 For compensation of the watchmen in the state  
105 house, in addition to their salary, according to  
106 resolves of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, chapter  
107 , four hundred dollars.

108 For allowance to Maria T. Benson, according to  
109 provisions of resolves of eighteen hundred and fifty-  
110 nine, chapter , four hundred dollars.

111 For expenses of reporting evidence and pay of  
 112 witnesses before the special committee of the house on  
 113 the liquor commission, five hundred dollars.  
 114 For compensation of the sergeant-at-arms, in addi-  
 115 tion to former appropriations for his salary, three  
 116 hundred dollars.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after  
 2 its passage.
