AN ACT

Concerning the Registry of Deeds in the several Counties.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. The registers of deeds in each district
2 shall from and after the first day of July next, keep
3 separate books of record for each town and city
4 wherein shall be recorded all deeds and instruments
5 conveying land in such town or city, and all other
6 papers and cautions relating thereto.

1 SECT. 2. In addition to the books of entry and
2 indexes now required to be kept, each register shall
3 keep a separate index for each volume of records
4 mentioned in the preceding section.
