AN ACT

To amend an Act to prevent Livery Stables from being erected in certain places in the Town of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. The first section of the one hundred and
2 twenty-fourth chapter of the statutes of the year
3 eighteen hundred and ten, passed on the eleventh
4 day of February, in the year eighteen hundred and
5 eleven, is hereby amended by inserting after the word
6 “God,” the following words, to wit: “without the
7 consent in writing of the proprietors of such church
8 or meeting-house, or of the religious society or parish
9 worshipping therein, and the consent of the mayor
10 and aldermen of the city of Boston.”

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from its passage.
