AN ACT

To confirm certain acts done by William Hobbs, Junior,
as a Notary Public.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
tives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of
the same, as follows:—*

1 SECT. 1. All acts done by William Hobbs,
2 Junior, of Roxbury in the county of Norfolk, as
3 a notary public, within and for the county of Suffolk,
4 between the fifteenth day of May and the twenty-
5 second day of November, in the year eighteen
6 hundred and sixty-two, are hereby made valid and
7 confirmed, to the same extent as though he had been
8 during that interval duly qualified to discharge the
9 duties of said office.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
