AN ACT

Concerning Probate Courts in the County of Plymouth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. Probate courts within and for the county
2 of Plymouth shall be held in each year at the times,
3 and within the towns hereinafter mentioned, viz. :
4 at Plymouth on the second Monday of every month,
5 except July and August ; at Wareham on the fourth
6 Monday of January ; at East Bridgewater on the
7 fourth Mondays of February and December ; at
8 Hingham on the fourth Monday of March ; at
9 Middleborough on the fourth Mondays of April,
10 July, and October ; at Abington on the fourth Mon-
11 days of May, August, and November ; at South
12 Scituate on the fourth Monday of June ; at Bridge-
13 water on the fourth Monday of September.

1 SECT. 2. So much of the one hundred and seven-
2 tenth chapter of the General Statutes, as requires
3 probate courts to be holden in the county of Plymouth
4 otherwise than is provided in this act, is hereby
5 repealed.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect on the first day
2 of July next; and all citations which have been
3 ordered to be returned to any probate court in the
4 county of Plymouth subsequent to said date, shall be
5 returned to the probate court at Middleborough on
6 the second Monday of said July, and the like pro-
7 ceedings may be had in respect to such citations as if
8 they had been returned as originally ordered.
