AN ACT

In addition to the Acts to incorporate the Massachusetts
Institute of Technology.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
tives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of
the same, as follows:—*

1 SECT. 1. When the Massachusetts Institute of
2 Technology shall have been duly organized, located,
3 and established, in conformity with the provisions of
4 chapter one hundred and eighty-three of the acts of
5 eighteen hundred and sixty-one, and chapter one hun-
6 dred and forty-two of the acts of eighteen hundred
7 and sixty-two, and as is hereinafter provided, there shall
8 be appropriated and paid to its treasurer, each year,
9 on the warrant of the governor, for its endowment,
10 support and maintenance, one-third part of the annual
11 interest or income, which may be received from the
12 fund, created under and by virtue of the one hundred
13 and thirtieth chapter of the acts of the thirty-seventh

14 congress, at the second session thereof, approved July
15 second, eighteen hundred and sixty-two, and the laws
16 of this Commonwealth, accepting the provisions
17 thereof and relating to the same.

1 SECT. 2. The leading object of the said Institute
2 of Technology shall be, without excluding other
3 scientific and classical studies, and including military
4 tactics, to teach such branches of learning as are
5 related to agriculture and the mechanic arts, in order
6 to promote the liberal and practical education of the
7 industrial classes in the several pursuits and pro-
8 fessions in life; and the governor, the chief justice of
9 the supreme judicial court, and the secretary of the
10 board of education, shall be each a member, *ex officio*,
11 of the board of trustees; and the legislature may
12 appoint or establish overseers, or visitors of the said
13 institute, with all necessary powers for the better aid,
14 preservation, and government thereof.

1 SECT. 3. Should the said corporation at any time
2 cease, or fail to maintain an institute, as and for the
3 purposes provided in this act and the beforementioned
4 act of congress, the aid granted to it by the first sec-
5 tion of this act, shall be withheld and not paid to it;
6 and an annual report of the mode in which the moneys
7 hereby appropriated are expended and used, shall be
8 made to the legislature at the commencement of its
9 session.

1 SECT. 4. This act shall be void, unless the said
2 Institute of Technology shall accept the same, and
3 give due notice thereof, to the secretary of the Com-
4 monwealth, on or before the first day of July next.
