In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-Six.

RESOLVE

Concerning the Mileage and Monthly Compensation of Members of the Legislature.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth to each member of the legislature one dollar for every five miles' travel, once in each session, from the place of his abode to the place of the sitting of the general court; (A) and at the end of every month during its session the sum of one hundred dollars: *provided*, that it shall appear by the certificate of the clerk of either house, that the pay of the member for the month at four dollars per day amounts to that sum, or at the rate of four dollars per day for any less time than twenty-five days; and each member shall certify to the clerk, in writing, a statement of the number of days he has been in attendance during the month. (B)
