AN ACT

In relation to the Third and Fourth Congressional Districts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. The second section of chapter two hun-
2 dred and twenty-six of the acts of the year eighteen
3 hundred and sixty-two is hereby so amended, in rela-
4 tion to the third congressional district, that the city
5 of Roxbury and the town of Brookline, in the county
6 of Norfolk, and the territory comprised in the wards
7 numbered five, seven, eight, ten, eleven and twelve, in
8 the city of Boston, in the county of Suffolk, shall
9 form one district, and be called district number three.

1 SECT. 2. The second section of chapter two hun-
2 dred and twenty-six of the acts of the year eighteen

3 hundred and sixty-two is hereby so amended, in rela-
4 tion to the fourth congressional district, that the
5 territory comprised in the wards numbered one, two,
6 three, four, six and nine, in the city of Boston, the
7 city of Chelsea, and the towns of North Chelsea and
8 Winthrop, in the county of Suffolk, shall form one
9 district, and be called district number four.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
