AN ACT

To incorporate the Suffolk Land Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1 SECT. 1. John F. Fenno, Horatio N. Page, John
2 H. Wilkinson, their associates and successors, are
3 hereby made a corporation by the name of the Suffolk
4 Land Company, with all the powers and privileges,
5 and subject to all the duties, liabilities and restrictions
6 set forth in all general laws which now are or here-
7 after may be in force relating to such corporations.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation may purchase and hold
2 the whole or any part of certain real estate in North
3 Chelsea known as the "Fenno farm," described in
4 two deeds, one of John Fenno to John F. Fenno,
5 dated June twenty-fourth, one thousand eight hundred

6 and fifty-seven, and recorded with Suffolk deeds, libro
7 seven hundred and twenty-eight, folio one hundred
8 and twenty-one; the other of Horatio N. Page and
9 John F. Fenno to Anna F. Page, dated June fifteenth,
10 one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and
11 recorded with Suffolk deeds, libro eight hundred and
12 thirty-seven, folio two hundred and twenty-two; and
13 also the land adjoining the aforesaid premises on the
14 north, belonging to Benjamin S. Welles and others,
15 containing about one hundred and eighteen acres;
16 and may grade and prepare the same for sale, and
17 sell and convey the whole or any part thereof which
18 they may purchase.

1 SECT. 3. The capital stock of said corporation
2 shall not exceed two hundred thousand dollars.
