AN ACT

In relation to Attachment by Trustee Process.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. In all cases of attachment by trustee
2 process, there shall be deducted from any sum of
3 money due from the supposed trustee to the princi-
4 pal defendant, the sum of twenty dollars, which shall
5 not be liable to be taken on the execution or reserved
6 for costs of the trustee.

1 SECT. 2. The costs of service upon a trustee shall
2 not be included in the judgment against the defend-
3 ant, if it appears from the answer of the supposed
4 trustee that there is not in his hands a sum sufficient
5 beyond the sum of twenty dollars to pay said costs,
6 in addition to the other costs of suit.

1 SECT. 3. In all cases in which the plaintiff shall
2 not recover in a suit the sum of twenty dollars, debt
3 or damage, the trustee shall be discharged, and the
4 plaintiff shall not recover any of the costs incurred
5 in the service upon the trustee.
