AN ACT

To incorporate the Nation Publishing House.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. James M. Usher, Richard F. Fuller,
2 William M. Thayer, their associates and successors,
3 are hereby made a corporation by the name of the
4 Nation Publishing House, for the purpose of printing
5 and publishing newspapers and books, and executing
6 job printing and binding, in the city of Boston, with
7 authority for that purpose to receive money or prop-
8 erty by gift, donation, devise, bequest, or otherwise ;
9 with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all
10 the duties, restrictions and liabilities set forth in the
11 sixty-eighth chapter of the General Statutes.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation, for the purposes afore-
2 said, may hold real and personal estate to the amount

3 of one hundred thousand dollars, and the whole capital
4 stock shall not exceed one hundred and fifty thousand
5 dollars, to be divided into shares of one hundred
6 dollars each.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
