Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty-seven.

AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses at the State Prison, Massachusetts Reformatory, the Reformatory Prison for Women, and for Expenses in connection therewith.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes herein specified, to meet expenses
5 for the year ending on the thirty-first day of
6 December in the year eighteen hundred and
7 eighty-seven, to wit:—

8 For the payment of salaries and wages at the
9 state prison at Boston, a sum not exceeding fifty
10 thousand dollars; and for other current expenses at
11 said institution, a sum not exceeding seventy-one
12 thousand five hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat.,
13 chap. 221; Acts 1882, chap. 203; 1884, chap.
14 255.]

15 For the payment of salaries and wages at the
16 Massachusetts reformatory at Concord, a sum not
17 exceeding fifty-seven thousand dollars; and for
18 other current expenses at said institution, a sum
19 not exceeding ninety-five thousand dollars.
20 [Acts 1884, chap. 255.]

21 For the payment of salaries and wages at the
22 reformatory prison for women at Sherborn, a sum
23 not exceeding twenty-three thousand dollars; and
24 for other current expenses at said institution, a
25 sum not exceeding thirty-six thousand eight hun-
26 dred dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 221; sects. 44,
27 45, 47 and 48.]

28 For expenses incurred in removing prisoners
29 to and from the reformatory prison for women, a
30 sum not exceeding two hundred dollars. [Pub.
31 Stat., chap. 219.]

32 For expenses incurred in removing prisoners to
33 and from the Massachusetts reformatory, a sum
34 not exceeding one thousand dollars. [Acts 1884,
35 chap. 255, sect. 18.]

36 For the salary of the agent for aiding convicts
37 discharged from the state prison, one thousand
38 dollars; and for expenses of such agents, a sum
39 not exceeding three thousand dollars, to be used
40 in rendering assistance to said convicts. [Pub.
41 Stat., chap. 219, sect. 26.]

42 For the salary of the agent for aiding dis-
43 charged female convicts, discharged from the
44 prisons of the Commonwealth, a sum not exceed-
45 ing seven hundred dollars; and for expenses of
46 said agent, and for assistance to said convicts, a

47 sum not exceeding two thousand three hundred
48 dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 219, sect. 27.]

49 For aiding prisoners discharged from the Mas-
50 sachusetts reformatory, a sum not exceeding three
51 thousand dollars, to be expended by the commis-
52 sioners of prisons. [Acts 1884, chap. 255, sect.
53 35.]

54 For the payment of the cost of supporting pris-
55 oners removed from the reformatory prison for
56 women, a sum not exceeding four hundred dol-
57 lars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 219, sect. 12.]

58 For board of prisoners removed from the Mas-
59 sachusetts reformatory, a sum not exceeding four
60 hundred dollars. [Acts 1884, chap. 255.]

61 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
62 commissioners of prisons, a sum not exceeding
63 eight hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 219.]

64 For travelling expenses of the commissioners
65 of prisons and of the secretary thereof, a sum not
66 exceeding eight hundred dollars. [Pub. Stat.,
67 chap. 219.]

68 For expenses incurred in the arrest of fugitives
69 from justice, a sum not exceeding two thousand
70 dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap. 218, sect. 6.]

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
