HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, March 17, 1887.

The Committee on Finance, to whom was referred the Bill to more clearly define the duties of the sergeant-at-arms, and to establish the salaries of certain of his appointees and to provide for their proper designation, report that the same ought to pass, with the following amendments, to wit:

In the 6th line of section one, after the word "building," insert these words, "and offices"; also in the 10th, 11th, 12th, 13th and 14th lines strike out the words "(except the secretary's office, council chamber, and apartments therewith connected, which shall be under the care of the messenger of the governor and council)," and insert in place thereof the following words: "(except the secretary's office, and the executive apartments, which shall be under the care of the respective messengers of those departments)"; also in the 30th line of said section, after the word "heating" strike out the word "and," and in the 31st line, after the word "ventilation" insert the words "and steam appliances," and after the word "house" insert the words "and Commonwealth building"; also in the 39th line, after the word "be" insert the word "both"; also in the 62d line, after the word "house" insert the words "the Commonwealth building and of any other building and offices in the use of the Commonwealth."
