### AN ACT

Providing for the Appointment of Assistant Assessors of Taxes in the City of Worcester.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The assessors of taxes in the city  
2 of Worcester shall annually in the month of April  
3 appoint one person in each ward of said city, who  
4 shall be a resident therein, to be an assistant  
5 assessor. Such assistant assessor, on being con-  
6 firmed by the mayor and board of aldermen of  
7 said city and having been sworn to the faithful  
8 performance of his duty, shall be qualified to per-  
9 form all the duties of assistant assessors under  
10 chapter one hundred and ninety-nine of the acts  
11 of eighteen hundred and sixty-six.

1 SECT. 2. Section twenty-five of the acts of  
2 eighteen hundred and sixty-six and all other acts

3 and parts of acts inconsistent with this chapter  
4 are hereby repealed.

1    SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage, but the persons elected assistant assess-  
3 ors under existing laws shall continue in office  
4 until the appointment and qualification of such  
5 officers under this act.

3 and parts of same inconsistent with this chapter  
 4 are hereby repealed.

- 1 Section 3. This act shall take effect upon the
- 2 passage, but the persons elected or appointed under
- 3 it under existing laws shall continue in office
- 4 until the expiration and publication of such
- 5 officers under this act.
