AN ACT

Concerning the Collection of Claims against the Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The superior court shall have jurisdiction of
2 all claims against the Commonwealth, whether at
3 law or in equity, except those mentioned in sec-
4 tion seven of chapter one hundred and ninety-
5 five of the Public Statutes, and all claims shall
6 be subject to the same set-off and recoupment as
7 they would be if the Commonwealth was a private
8 person, and shall be enforced in accordance with
9 the provisions of chapter one hundred and ninety-
10 five of the Public Statutes.
